



## ROSENTHAL & SANDERS DUO

### LINDA ROSENTHAL, violin

Violinist Linda Rosenthal performs throughout North America, Europe and Asia in recitals, as a soloist with orchestras and as a chamber musician. She has appeared as soloist with the National Symphony Orchestra at the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C. and on tour under the direction of Mstislav Rostropovich. Other performances include an international recital tour of Japan, Taiwan, China, India and Great Britain, Hong Kong and Thailand and appearances throughout North America.

In addition to a busy schedule performing solo and chamber music, Ms. Rosenthal tours *Strings & Stories*, a dynamic pairing of violin and theater for young audiences. Since its premiere in 1995 at the Kennedy Center in Washington D. C., Ms. Rosenthal and Los Angeles actor Bill Blush have performed *Strings & Stories* annually for thousands of children across the country.

Ms. Rosenthal is Founder and Artistic Director of *Juneau Jazz & Classics*, an annual 10-day music festival that brings internationally renowned jazz, classical and blues artists to perform and teach in Juneau each May. She is also Artistic Director of the Lake Placid Chamber Music Seminar in Lake Placid, NY.

Ms. Rosenthal's solo CDs include *Fiddle De Bop* on Town Hall Records; *Three American Sonatas* on Bay Cities label; *Favorite Violin Encores* on Topaz; and, *Oh! That Stradivarius* and *The Artistry of Linda Rosenthal* on First Impressions Music.

### JACK SANDERS, guitar

As a soloist, chamber musician and teacher, Los Angeles-based guitarist Jack Sanders has performed at the Sitka Summer Music Festival, Kapalua Music Festival of Hawaii, Arrowhead Bach Festival, and made solo appearances with numerous orchestras, including the Illinois Chamber Orchestra, Chamber Orchestra of Santa Fe, Orange County Chamber Orchestra and South Coast Symphony. He has performed with the St. Petersburg, Colorado, and Angeles String Quartets, the vocal group I Cantori, and the contemporary chamber ensemble XTET. Radio appearances have included NPR's nationally broadcast "West Coast Live."

In 1984 Mr. Sanders formed a duo with violinist Clayton Haslop, touring for the California Arts Council, throughout China and at numerous festivals throughout North America. The Duo has recorded for Centaur Records and Townhall Records. A solo recording by Mr. Sanders featuring the Preludes of Ponce, Villa-Lobos and Carlevaro was released by Townhall Records in the Spring of 2000. As a Piatigorsky Foundation artist, Mr. Sanders performs extensively throughout the United States each year as a solo recitalist.
